Raphael Sagarra's focus centers on addressing pressing sociocultural issues in contemporary Brazil, notably miscegenation and the notion of borders. His signature style is characterized by meticulously chosen colors and materials, such as various types of wood, establishing profound symbolic ties to Brazil's rich cultural, religious, and popular heritage. Through the reinterpretation of visual elements drawn from subcultures' popular imagery, Sagarra confronts issues of marginalization, illegality, and societal norms, purposefully infusing new meaning into elements often overlooked. His works exude vibrant, shifting color palettes, embodying a fleeting allure that harmonizes the essence of his creations. Sagarra's international presence, rooted in his beginnings as a street artist, extends to cultural capitals around the world, from London to New York, exhibiting his work on walls and in esteemed exhibitions. Notably, his contributions have been recognized by esteemed institutions like the Museu de Arte do Rio in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil. Recent solo exhibitions include presentations at the Investec Cape Town Art Fair 2024 with Reiners Contemporary Art, the Museu de Arte Contemporânea de MS in Brazil, and the Museu de Arte de Blumenau, also in Brazil.
